The Event

The event shall be a **State Championship Motorkhana** and be known as the QLD Motorkhana Championship & Series

Authority

The event is authorised by Motorsport Australia permit No. **422/0409/01** and shall be conducted under the provisions of the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport Australia, the current Motorsport Australia Khanacross and Motorkhana Regulations, the Motorsport Australia Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) Policy, the Motorsport Australia Come and Try Policy, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations, addenda and instructions. This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Motorsport Australia Safety 1st and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the event. Entries

Entries open upon publication of these regulations and close Friday 2nd September 2022

The Entry fee is \$60.00 Adults and \$30.00 for Juniors and must be accompanied by an official entry form

- Entries must be submitted in advance via online entry form at www.hscq.com
- As of the March 4th easing of Qld Covid restrictions, an outdoor motorsport event does not require any mandatory use of Check-In Qld app (either for proof of vaccination or venue contact tracing).
- Owners of any (Qld) road registered vehicles must obtain their CTP Rally Extension letter and email it to entries@hscq.com prior to the day of the event. This is obtained by requesting it from the CTP provider listed on the vehicle registration.
- Entries may be refused in accordance with the NCR of the current Motorsport Australia Manual
- The maximum number of entries will be 60 in order of receipt

Licences

Competitors will have their Motorsport Australia licences checked prior to the event through the Motorsport Australia electronic platform and it is **not** required to show their licence in person at the Secretary's Office.

All competitors must be a member of a Motorsport Australia affiliated club and be in possession of a relevant and current Motorsport Australia Competition Licence Speed/Speed Junior or higher.

Abandonment

The organisers reserve the right to cancel the event if the total number of competitors is less than twenty (20). The event may be altered, postponed, abandoned or cancelled at the sole discretion of the organisers, subject to the provisions of the NCR of Motorsport Australia.

Venue

The event shall be conducted at, Queensland Raceway 28th August 2022. The type of surface shall be sealed.

Timetable

Scrutiny will start at the venue at 8.00 am., 28/08/2022

Competitors Briefing will be held at 9.45 am.

The event shall start at 10.00 am.

The Briefing will be held outdoors and Social Distancing will be adhered to at all times

Alcohol, drug and other Substances

Any holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of any drug or other banned substance and subject to a penalty for a breach of the Australian National Anti-Doping Policy and/or the Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy at www.motorsport.org.au.

Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any other Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day. The holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy at www.motorsport.org.au.

Scrutiny

Scrutiny will be conducted at this event, while maintaining social distance requirements at all times.

Vehicles shall comply with General Requirements for Cars & Drivers Schedule A and Group 4H of the current Motorsport Australia Manual. Fuel must comply with Schedule G of the current Motorsport Australia Manual. Vehicles must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions. All vehicles with a Motorsport Australia Log Book must present at Scrutiny.

Approved crash helmets are required for all open vehicles in Motorkhana.

Motorkhana Classes

There will be seven classes as follows:

Class A= wheelbase up to 2150mm

Class B= wheelbase from 2151 to 2390mm

Class C= wheelbase from 2391 to 2574mm

Class D= wheelbase 2575mm and over

Class E = Production vehicles with 4 wheel drive

Class F = Front wheel drive specials

Class G = Rear wheel drive specials

Production vehicles fitted with a hand braking system other than:

- Standard
- Changed mechanical advantage
- Hydraulic
- Altered ratchet

Or any vehicle which in the opinion of Motorsport Australia represents an attempt to circumvent or defeat the spirit of the concept of a production vehicle shall be classified as a Special.

Timing

Electronic & or Manual timing shall be used. Timing shall start at the competitors own time when the vehicle breaks the designated timing line and cease when the foremost part of the vehicle crosses the finish line.

Penalties

Penalties shall be awarded in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Motorkhana Regulations.

QMS Point Scoring (Results)

Qld Championship Competitors shall be ranked by outright time overall and in Class.

All competitors in the Queensland Motorkhana Series shall be ranked according to their total handicap times after all tests have been completed by all competitors. Competitors shall be awarded points according to their ranking which shall count towards their overall total for the Queensland Motorkhana Series. The points shall be awarded in accordance with the method decided on by the Queensland Motorkhana Advisory Panel.

QMS Timing Handicaps

Class A as recorded multiplied by 0.86

Class B as recorded multiplied by 0.86

Class C as recorded multiplied by 0.82

Class D as recorded multiplied by 0.81

Class E as recorded multiplied by 0.81

Class F as recorded multiplied by 1.00

Class G as recorded multiplied by 1.00

Judges of Fact

All officials and Timekeepers at test areas shall be deemed as Judges of Fact in accordance with NCR in the current Motorsport Australia Manual and Motorkhana Standing Regulations - Version 2.

Protests/ Appeals

Protests must be lodged in accordance with the current Motorsport Australia Manual

General

PASSENGERS AS INSTRUCTORS ONLY

This Event may include a Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the Motorsport Australia MSPRA Policy. Passengers are only allowed where their role is as an 'Instructor'.

Tests

A minimum of four (4) and a maximum of twelve (12) tests will be conducted, chosen by the Organisers from the following list tests from Part A of the Motorsport Australia Motorkhana Tests Booklet:

Star, Bowler, Top Hat, Pentagon, Double Kidney, Dollar, Multiple Loop, Butterfly, Corridor, Mothballs, Paddy, and Hopkirk
