The Event

The event shall be a **State Championship Khanacross** and be known as the Qld Khanacross Championship

Authority

The event is authorised by Motorsport Australia permit No. **422/1311/01** and shall be conducted under the provisions of the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport Australia, the current Motorsport Australia Khanacross, the Motorsport Australia Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) Policy, the Motorsport Australia Come and Try Policy, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations, addenda and instructions. The Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Safety 1st, Integrity and Legal, and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au. Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the event. Entries

Entries open upon publication of these regulations and close Friday 11th November 2022

The Entry fee is \$60.00 Adults and \$30.00 for Juniors and must be accompanied by an official entry form

- Entries must be submitted in advance via online entry form at www.hscq.com
- As of the March 4th easing of Qld Covid restrictions, an outdoor motorsport event does not require any mandatory use of Check-In Qld app (either for proof of vaccination or venue contact tracing).
- Owners of any (Qld) road registered vehicles must obtain their CTP Rally Extension letter and email it to entries@hscq.com prior to the day of the event. This is obtained by requesting it from the CTP provider listed on the vehicle registration.
- Entries may be refused in accordance with the NCR of the Motorsport Australia Manual
- The maximum number of entries will be 60 in order of receipt

Licences

Competitors will have their Motorsport Australia licences checked prior to the event through the Motorsport Australia electronic platform and it is **not** required to show their licence in person at the Secretary's Office.

All competitors must be a member of a Motorsport Australia affiliated club and be in possession of a relevant and current Motorsport Australia Competition Licence Speed/Speed Junior or higher.

Abandonment

The organisers reserve the right to cancel the event if the total number of competitors is less than twenty (20). The event may be altered, postponed, abandoned or cancelled at the sole discretion of the organisers, subject to the provisions of the NCR of Motorsport Australia.

Venue

The event shall be conducted at, Willowbank Raceway 13th November, 2022. The type of surface shall be sealed.

Timetable

Scrutiny will start at the venue at 8.00 am., 13/11/2022

Competitors Briefing will be held at 10.15 am.

The event shall start at 10.30 am.

The Briefing will be held outdoors and Social Distancing will be adhered to at all times

Alcohol, drug and other Substances

The holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of any drug or other banned substance and subject to a penalty for a breach of the Australian National Anti-Doping Policy and/or the Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy at www.motorsport.org.au.

Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any other Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day. The holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy at www.motorsport.org.au.

Scrutiny

Scrutiny will be conducted at this event, while maintaining social distance requirements at all times

Vehicles shall comply with General Requirements for Cars & Drivers Schedule A and Group 4K of the Motorsport Australia Manual.

Fuel must comply with Schedule G of the Motorsport Australia Manual. Vehicles must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions. All vehicles with a Motorsport Australia Log Book must present at Scrutiny.

Approved crash helmets and mounted 900g Fire Extinguishers are required for all vehicles in Khanacross.

Rotary engine vehicles engine capacity will be determined by multiplying the capacity by 1.8 times.

Supercharged & Turbocharged engine vehicles will have their engine capacity multiplied by 1.7 times for spark ignition engines and 1.5 times for diesel engines.

Convoy Run

A convoy run shall be conducted of all competitors on each course before competition starts.

Timing

Electronic & or Manual timing shall be used. Timing shall start at the competitors own time when the vehicle breaks the designated timing line and cease when the foremost part of the vehicle crosses the finish line.

Penalties

Penalties shall be awarded in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Khanacross Regulations.

Pointscoreing (Results)

There will be a minimum of 3 and maximum of 4 runs at each test (preferably 4 if time/weather permits).

Qld Championship Competitors shall be ranked by outright time overall and in Class. All runs will count.

The Inter-Club Challenge results will be ranked the same except their total time will be combine after dropping the slowest run time, thereby using the Fastest 2 times (of 3 runs) or 3 times (of 4 runs).

Judges of Fact

All officials and timekeepers at test areas shall be deemed as Judges of Fact in accordance with NCR in the current Motorsport Australia Manual and Motorkhana Standing Regulations - Version 2.

Protests/ Appeals

Protests must be lodged in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Manual

Trophies

Trophies may be awarded to Queensland Khanacross Championship Competitors as per list below:

1st, 2nd, & 3rd Outright and 1st, & 2nd in each Class

General

PASSENGERS AS APPROVED INSTRUCTORS OF JUNIOR ONLY

No passengers will be allowed to be carried in competing vehicles unless that passenger is an adult acting as an instructor and safety person for a junior and only when approved by the Clerk of Course and in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) Policy.
